
The Bureau of Historic Sites



Fort Constitution, New Castle NH

The Bureau of Historic Sites was created in 2007 to ensure ongoing stewardship, interpretation, and preservation of New Hampshire's State Historic Sites. The goal of the Bureau is to develop ongoing recognition and appreciation for these sites which are so important to the history of New Hampshire. The Bureau oversees about 20 sites statewide, and four of these sites are located at the seacoast: Fort Stark, Fort Constitution, the Wentworth-Coolidge Mansion, and White Island.

A comprehensive conditions assessment with treatment recommendation has been funded by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) and contracted for Fort Constitution State Historic Site. These recommendations will guide the Bureau of Historic Sites in their preservation efforts, with the goal to improve the current structural conditions and extend the life of the Fort. The company chosen to carry out this work is AEON Preservation Services LLC (AEON), a qualified vender with decades of experience in historic fortifications and masonry.
